## LIBRARY UPDATE

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When people think of their public library, the first thing they think of is often books. But libraries today provide access to information in many ways. At all times, but especially during times of crisis such as the pandemic and wildfire emergencies, access to vital information can be critical for underserved communities. Our Ventura County Library System plays a part in building information access equity across the county.

For example, libraries that are part of the Ventura County Library System loan free Computer Kits that contain Chromebooks and WiFi hotspots to older adults and people with disabilities so they can connect with services and information online and participate in public affairs and help shape decisions. Over 330 Computer Kits were checked out within the first three months of this program that was launched in mid-July 2021. Library branches also have computer labs and free WiFi access available to the public. And the Ventura County Mobile Library distributed pandemic information to underserved communities at many sites throughout the county last year. Librarians field inquiries in-person, on the phone and online, helping people find information and connect them to services of all kinds throughout the community. An extra effort has been made to hire bilingual library staff members to translate information into Spanish when needed. And we are actively working on seeking federal E-rate and grant funds to support the digital infrastructure of our library facilities and improve and expand internet services to connect more people with information. And yes, we continue to prioritize and offer a robust collection of print and electronic library books and materials full of information and freely available to all.

The Ventura County Library System strives to continue to play a role in building information access equity across the county in 2022 and will work with many community partners to do so. We are interested in hearing from you or your organization if you'd like to collaborate with the public library to build information access equity in Ventura County.








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# MAKE AN ORIGAMI FOX





Did you know that Ventura County has a native species of fox?! The island fox is an endangered species that lives on the Channel Islands.

#### **Quick and Cool Facts**

- The island fox is the only carnivore unique to California.
- Although the island fox is one of the smallest canids in the world, it is the largest native terrestrial mammal on the Channel Islands.
- The island fox is one-third smaller than its mainland ancestor, the gray fox. At 12 to 13 inches in height and 4 to 5 pounds, the island fox is about the size of a housecat.
- Some individuals have been known to live up to 15 years.
- Unlike nocturnal gray foxes, which hunt exclusively at night to avoid predators, island foxes have no natural predators, allowing them to be active during daylight hours with peaks in activity occurring at dusk and dawn.
- Visually, island foxes show signs of dominance or submission through facial expressions and body
- They communicate by barking and sometimes growling.
- Their keen sense of smell plays an important role in the marking of territories. Island foxes are known to scent-mark their territories with a few drops of urine and tend to concentrate scats in particular areas, often conspicuously positioned on well-traveled paths.
